"Earthquakes and Earth Energies-Dowsing the Unseen"


Lee Barnes is well known to our Chapter as one of our Basic

Dowsing Instructors and as a past President and active Board member.

Dr. Barnes is a professional water well dowser and teaches basic and expanded dowsing techniques in his Applied Intuition classes.

Lee will share his experiences and understanding of how regional geology, flowing underground aquifers, and geological faults affects subtle Earth Energies. He will review regional geology and discuss the recent area earthquakes, including the possible effects on springs, water well yield and earth light phenomena such as the famous Brown Mountain Lights.

(828-296-9522) From the point of view of energy, earthquakes present some interesting questions for dowsers. The "old timers" (Vern Peterson in particular) pointed out years ago that tremors, even slight ones as far away from here as TN, were known to throw off our work on diverting geopathogenic zones in houses, etc., requiring us to ask in our prayers that the energy alterations we request be "permanent". This was in the days of planting rebar in the ground to divert the zones, but it also applies to mental diversions (or conversions of these zones into a benevolent frequency, as many of us do today). This presupposes that tremors can affect thought forms, mental constructs, as well as geomagnetic fields produced by water, fault lines, lightening strikes and the like. Then there is the interesting question of how animals - even some people can somehow sense the approach of a quake, even if it is underwater and at a distance, in time to leave the area.

Case in point: the disastrous quake and tsunami of last year. Apparently the pressure of geological plates moving against each other produces some kind of magnetic field that becomes critically intense at some point that can be sensed. Could that point have been dowsed, say, in the case of our "Hot Springs" tremor a few months ago? Taking Lee's knowledge of faulting in this area, could the pressure of each fault be measured on a 1 - 10 scale, and the "critical" zone be determined by dowsing? Before a major event? It seems to me that if Lee can dowse the course a hurricane will take (and perhaps the force) - which surely has to do with energy -, could we not "tune in" on the "intentions" energy of geological plates? As RIP would say, "dowse it".

FROM THE FIELD

This In From The Field (NSA intercept):

In a Dec.13 e-mail from Lee Barnes to our tech man Joseph: "The recent regional earthquakes are only some relatively gentle 'burping' of our moving earth. (I'll tell you later about being 30 miles from a 7.0 earthquake/shake in California!). WNC has lots...of faults, which can be easily dowsed after practicing over known faults (ah!, field trip opportunity...). There are about 20 different rock types in Haywood Co. alone, each separated by fault lines, with thousands of minor fractures. (It) seems our granitic rocks like to fracture at 60 degree angles, so there are distinct relationships between surface exposure rock "strick and dip" (sic.) and underground fractures. In general, ground rock is most fractured in ravines/gullies where steeper and well established side creeks flow, the broken rock surfaces tend(ing) to channel the surface water which continues to carve the mountainsides over millennia. Cood (location) for a well if you can get the well rig in! The first quake this year was centered just east of Hot Springs. Hot Springs has thermal springs because of thin crust and/or contact with fault plates. This is the edge of limestone rocks (which I find flavor the water). Regional mountain topography suggests major fault lines running between Hot Springs and (the) Burnsville area. The biggest earthquake in NC was a 5.7 near Waynesville in (around) 1916, up in the Balsams. I think the last really big push was along the Brevard Fault, maybe 200 million years ago, which formed most of upland WNC. I personally like lots of small quakes relieving pressures." RIP, ever wise-cracking, would say: "Hey, about that "gentle burping", ask the folks in Hot Springs!"

RIP's Quips and Questions

Some time after the latest ground-and-people shaking quake (centered around Hot Springs), RIP wrote in with the following question - obvious for most dowsers: "Can earthquakes, even minor ones, disturb distant water veins enough to alter the output of wells?" Apparently so, says Lee Barnes, who writes: "I recently dowsed a new well site for a 1000 ft. deep, 1 pint a minute well which went dry after the first quake. Historically, quakes will affect the flow of springs and wells, ... even displacing them to new outlets." He goes on to note that he found a much better source (20gpm!) some 50 ft. away, but adds that dowsers often can relocate a vein within a few feet of a dry well. RIP was then quick to ask: "Well," (no pun intended), "you mean to say that quake moved a dribble of water 50 feet and revved it up to 20gpm?" That RIP...what a presumptuous old wise-acre! Still, do you suppose...? Dowse it!

GETTING TO LEICESTER COMMUNITY CENTER

From Asheville, 40 East and 26 West: Taking 240 West (be in left lane when it splits) to 19-23 south (Patton Avenue), be in the left two lanes on Westgate Bridge to hit Patton Ave. 4th light is Leicester Hwy (State Hwy 63) by Ingles (the two right lanes turn onto Leicester Hwy.) Follow Leicester Hwy for about 9 miles, during which you will pass another Ingles grocery store and signs for Erwin Middle and High Schools, and Leicester Hwy will turn into two lanes. After you pass signs for the Leicester Elementary School, and Leicester Supply Company to your right, begin looking for the Community Center. It will be on your right less than one mile past the Leicester Supply Company.

From 26 East: Interstate 26 (going west) will merge with Interstate 40; take I-40 West to Exit 44. Follow directions "From 40-West".

From 40 West: Take Interstate 40 East until you reach Exit 44. Make a LEFT off the exit ramp, following 19/23/Patton Ave until you reach Leicester Hwy (63), which will be on your left by the second Ingles grocery store. Follow above directions "From Asheville".
